**Indigo Road's** debut single, the double A side single, 'Simple/Goodbye to You' enjoyed a very positive reaction and considerable airplay on regional BBC radio when it was released in mid 2008.

The band's long-awaited follow up, another double A-side comprising '**Hey It's Alright**' and '**Up for Air**' will be released in February and once again the band have called on the film making talents of John James Fox.

Both video's feature highly regarded London vocalist Belle Erskine (who has sung with the likes of Whitney Houston & Groove Armada) and creator of the Indigo Road ethos Mark Herbert. In their usual mix of grit meeting glamour the band manage to cover their dark underside with sweet vocals. This is the latest release as part of band leader Mark Herbert's plan to keep things fresh by regularly bringing new musicians into the mix with every new turn.

The current band include singer/songwriter and producer Danny Hook on guitar and drummer Katie Stephenson from percussion duo 'Bang On' on '**Hey It's Alright**', a ballad with more than a hint of menace. The Hitchcockian violin (think 'Psycho', perhaps) and Danny Hook's burst of guitar playing suggest that all is not as it should be in the mind of the singer.

'**Up for Air**' is a song of joy and release, building to an unrestrained climax as Belle lets go the full force of her vocals, supported by some memorable sax blowing from respected session player Ian Richards. Guitar and drum duties are handled by two musicians from new band Sleepscape, Chris Berry (guitar) and Ruwan Kodikara (drums).
